PUBLIC SERVANT PROFILE

Interview with U.S. Senator Steve Daines of Montana



Each week, elected officials from both sides of the aisle gather in the heart of Washington, D.C. to study God’s Word together. We recently interviewed Senator Steve Daines of Montana to hear how this Bible study is shaping his faith, leadership, and service in Congress.

Q: How has attending the Bible study impacted your personal faith journey or help you apply biblical principles as you carry out your role as a public servant?

Senator Daines: I think one of the important impacts is keeping us accountable by being in the Word of God on a weekly basis in the midst of the chaos of Washington, D.C. You know, we need frequent reminders, and in this case, it’s a weekly reminder, that God is God,

When a believer emphasizes the Word of God at the expense of the personal presence and guidance of the Holy Spirit, he will dry up. When a believer emphasizes the Holy Spirit at the expense of the Word of God, he will blow up. But when the believer emphasizes both, he will grow up.

Ideally, these kinds of summarizing thoughts will aid you in your spiritual pilgrimage. This chapter’s topic, related to the basics of salvation, addresses how He saves those who believe. How is Jesus’ redeeming work applied to man? How do we know if someone is a Christian? God has decreed or ordained a plan of salvation that He has revealed to all in the Bible.

I. GOD’S SOVEREIGNTY IN SALVATION

A. GOD’S SOVEREIGN PLAN OF SALVATION

Look at Romans 8:29–30: ²⁹*For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren;* ³⁰*and these whom He predestined, He also called; and these whom He called, He also justified; and these whom He justified, He also glorified.*

Read Ephesians 1:4–7: ⁴*Just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we would be holy and blameless before Him. In love* ⁵*He predestined us to adoption as sons through Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the kind intention of His will,* ⁶*to the praise of the glory of His grace, which He freely bestowed on us in the Beloved.* ⁷*In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace.*

What has been God’s plan before the foundation of the world (v. 4)?

What is the purpose of His plan of salvation relative to individuals (v. 4)?

What is the purpose of His plan of salvation relative to Himself (v. 7)?



In his classic book, *Knowing God*, J. I. Packer provides a great definition of *grace*:

In the New Testament, *grace* means God's love in action toward men who merited the opposite of love. *Grace* means God's moving heaven and earth to save sinners who could not lift a finger to save themselves. *Grace* means God's sending His only Son to descend into hell on the cross so that we guilty ones might be reconciled to God and received into heaven. "For he [God] hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him" [2 Corinthians 5:21 KJV].¹

B. GOD IMPLEMENTS HIS PLAN OF SALVATION

What does God (the Holy Spirit) do concerning sin? "*And He, when He comes, will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment*" (John 16:8).

Why is the conviction of sin necessary?

*"The heart is more deceitful than all else
And is desperately sick;
Who can understand it?"* (Jeremiah 17:9).

As it is written,

*"THERE IS NONE RIGHTEOUS, NOT EVEN ONE;
THERE IS NONE WHO UNDERSTANDS,
THERE IS NONE WHO SEEKS FOR GOD;
ALL HAVE TURNED ASIDE, TOGETHER THEY HAVE BECOME USELESS;
THERE IS NONE WHO DOES GOOD,
THERE IS NOT EVEN ONE."*

*"THEIR THROAT IS AN OPEN GRAVE,
WITH THEIR TONGUES THEY KEEP DECEIVING,"
"THE POISON OF ASPS IS UNDER THEIR LIPS;"
"WHOSE MOUTH IS FULL OF CURSING AND BITTERNESS";
"THEIR FEET ARE SWIFT TO SHED BLOOD,
DESTRUCTION AND MISERY ARE IN THEIR PATHS,
AND THE PATH OF PEACE THEY HAVE NOT KNOWN."
"THERE IS NO FEAR OF GOD BEFORE THEIR EYES."*

Now we know that whatever the Law says, it speaks to those who are under the Law, so that every mouth may be closed and all the world may become accountable to God (Romans 3:10–19).

and we are not. And it's just a fundamental principle. Think about the Lord's Prayer—it begins with "Our Father who art in Heaven," and it starts that way for a reason. It's just reestablishing the truth that God is God, He is in control, and we are not. That is one very important principle that we need to be applying daily in our lives here in Washington.

Q: What sets this study apart from others that you've participated in in the past?

Senator Daines: Well, it's meat. And I think the doctrinal depth of the study and pushing us to exercise our brain muscles is very, very important as we seek to love the Lord with all of our mind. It's really developing our minds—the minds that God gave us—and that's something Ralph challenges us in. It's about becoming better students of the Word. And in doing so, that understanding makes us better at applying it—we're applying the truth.

Q: Why do you believe this ministry is especially needed today in Congress?

Senator Daines: Think about the myriad of major decisions that we make in Washington and how we need God's wisdom more than ever before, because the decisions that are made here not only affect the country but

What is needed before someone can know the truth? *With gentleness correcting those who are in opposition, if perhaps God may grant them repentance leading to the knowledge of the truth* (2 Timothy 2:25).

Who grants it?

Read John 1:12–13: ¹²*But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name,* ¹³*who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.* According to verse 12, who grants us the right to become children of God?

How do you reconcile all the previous passages with verse 12, which teaches that every individual must receive Christ? *Answer: God is the author of the desire and will in every individual who eventually receives Christ. This way God gets the glory when someone comes to Christ for salvation.*

In John 1:13 notice that this right or privilege is not granted to us because of the following:

- Our birth (**born not of blood**)
- Our own efforts (**the will of the flesh**)
- Our own volition (**the will of man**)

Who causes growth in a believer? *I planted, Apollos watered, but God was causing the growth* (1 Corinthians 3:6).

Who will cause the resurrection of the believer to occur? *Now God has not only raised the Lord, but will also raise us up through His power* (1 Corinthians 6:14).

C. GOD CULMINATES HIS PLAN OF SALVATION

Look again at Romans 8:29: *For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren.* To whose image will believers be ultimately conformed?

Who will transform every believer? *For our citizenship is in heaven, from which also we eagerly wait for a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ; who will transform the body of our humble state into conformity with the body of His glory, by the exertion of the power that He has even to subject all things to Himself* (Philippians 3:20–21).

Who delivers the believer to heaven? *“Father, I desire that they also, whom You have given Me, be with Me where I am, so that they may see My glory which You have given Me, for You loved Me before the foundation of the world”* (John 17:24).

II. CONVERSION

Numbers 21:5–9 records how the children of Israel sinned against God, and God sent deadly snakes that bit them, bringing death. The people realized their sin and asked for deliverance. God instructed Moses to make a fiery bronze serpent, attach it to a pole, and when someone was bitten, the person could simply look on it and be saved. That “looking and living” illustrates conversion; however, instead of a snake on a pole, we have the Son of God on a cross!

A. CONVICTION OF SIN IN SALVATION

What has God given to mankind to reveal their sinfulness? *Because by the works of the Law no flesh will be justified in His sight; for through the Law comes the knowledge of sin* (Romans 3:20).

When the people realized their error in crucifying Christ, how did they feel in their hearts? *“Therefore let all the house of Israel know for certain that God has made Him both Lord and Christ—this Jesus whom you crucified.” Now when they heard this, they were pierced to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, “Brethren, what shall we do?”* (Acts 2:36–37).

have effects on the entire world. In dealing with that, we’ve got to have God’s wisdom.

Q: What would you say, Senator, to a colleague who might be a little bit hesitant about coming with you or joining the study?

Senator Daines: Well, first, I’d say it’s a very friendly group. It’s a humble group. We’ve had a number of members over the years who have never, ever even studied the Bible before. So, whether you come as a relative novice or somebody who would be skiing the black diamond runs as an expert, there’s something there for everybody. I’ve seen members who have never ever studied the Bible. This is their first experience being in a Bible study, and they’ve just flourished in doing so.

Q: If you could sum up the study in a sentence or two or three, what would it be?

Senator Daines: One word would be effective. Another—if you’re allowed to go more than one word—I think it’s a significant return on investment.

Another thing: we are just thankful for Ralph and Danielle and the sacrifice they make in commuting back and forth from the West Coast to Washington, D.C. every week to teach us. We are grateful for their service and sacrifice.



MINISTRY UPDATE

From San Diego to the Frontlines of Faith in Alaska: The Story of Jonathan Fisher, New State Ministry Leader for Alaska



Raised in the church by a father who was a pastor, Jonathan felt the tug toward ministry early in life. “I kind of grew up around the ministry all my life,” he recalls. “I had a heart for it.” That calling became official when he entered seminary at 18, eventually serving in San Diego as an assistant pastor and helping to plant churches.

But it was a prayer letter—quiet and unassuming—that changed the trajectory of his life. It spoke of four Alaskan communities with churches, parsonages, and congregants—yet no pastors. Jonathan and his wife began praying daily that God would send someone. “Never once did

B. REPENTANCE FROM SIN IN SALVATION

Why did the tax collector cry out to God? *“But the tax collector, standing some distance away, was even unwilling to lift up his eyes to heaven, but was beating his breast, saying, ‘God, be merciful to me, the sinner!’”* (Luke 18:13).

Read 2 Corinthians 7:9–10: ⁹*I now rejoice, not that you were made sorrowful, but that you were made sorrowful to the point of repentance; for you were made sorrowful according to the will of God, so that you might not suffer loss in anything through us.* ¹⁰*For the sorrow that is according to the will of God produces a repentance without regret, leading to salvation, but the sorrow of the world produces death.*

What does godly sorrow over sin produce (v. 10)?

What does it lead to (v. 10)?

Repentance means a turning away from sin and turning to God.

C. TURNING TO CHRIST IN SALVATION

When anyone who had been bitten by a deadly snake looked at the serpent on the pole, he or she was exercising faith in what God said. What promise is given to those who call upon the name of the Lord? *For “WHOEVER WILL CALL ON THE NAME OF THE LORD WILL BE SAVED”* (Romans 10:13).

Read Romans 10:8–10: ⁸*But what does it say? “THE WORD IS NEAR YOU, IN YOUR MOUTH AND IN YOUR HEART”—that is, the word of faith which we are preaching,* ⁹*that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved;* ¹⁰*for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation.*



Faith is required for salvation. What must you confess (v. 9)?

What must you believe (v. 9)?

Faith means trusting in, clinging to, or embracing Jesus Christ who is the object of our faith.

D. BECOMING SLAVES TO RIGHTEOUSNESS IN SALVATION

Read Romans 8:1–2: *¹Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. ²For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death.*

For the believer in Christ, what is the penalty for sin (v. 1)?

From what two things is the believer free (v. 2)?

When freed from sin, what does a believer become? *And having been freed from sin, you became slaves of righteousness* (Romans 6:18).

What benefit results? *But now having been freed from sin and enslaved to God, you derive your benefit, resulting in sanctification, and the outcome, eternal life* (Romans 6:22).

Sanctification is the process of being conformed to the image of Jesus Christ.

I think it would be us,” he says. But two months later, the call became clear.

They packed their bags and their four children and moved from the sun-drenched streets of San Diego County to Juneau, Alaska—a capital city unreachable by road, accessible only by boat or plane. “We tried to forsake our old identity and become Alaskans,” he says. “One of the first things we did was go outside every day, no matter what.”

Now, Jonathan pastors a church in Juneau and leads a unique ministry to public officials as the Capitol Ministries State Ministry Leader. Through weekly Bible studies and pastoral care, he ministers to senators and representatives, many of whom have spiritual struggles hidden behind political roles. “They’re just like us,” Jonathan says. “They have families. They have prayer requests. They need someone who isn’t chasing an agenda.”

His approach is refreshingly simple: show up, love people, and let the Holy Spirit do the rest. “Sometimes I may be teaching something and not even realize how the Holy Spirit is applying it to their exact situation.”

Leader for Alaska, Pastor Jonathan regularly attended the Bible Study led by Dr. Randy Covington in the capital city of Juneau. The group—made up of 20 consistent participants, including legislators, Capitol staff, aides, and heads of state agencies—gathered to dive into the Scriptures. Jonathan occasionally filled in for Dr. Covington, and in early 2025, he officially stepped into the role of CapMin State Ministry Leader.



Age hasn't been a barrier—despite his being just 35. "I grew a beard to look older," he jokes. But more seriously, he leans on Paul's words to Timothy: Let no one look down on your youthfulness. "People care

E. EVIDENCES OF SALVATION

Three important evidences of a true believer are faith that works, love that labors, and hope that endures. *Constantly bearing in mind your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ in the presence of our God and Father, knowing, brethren beloved by God, His choice of you* (1 Thessalonians 1:3–4).

F. TRUE SALVATION CREATES A FAITH THAT WORKS

What reveals genuine faith? *But someone may well say, "You have faith and I have works; show me your faith without the works, and I will show you my faith by my works"* (James 2:18).

In this you greatly rejoice, even though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been distressed by various trials, so that the proof of your faith, being more precious than gold which is perishable, even though tested by fire, may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ (1 Peter 1:6–7).

For what did God prepare believers? *For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them* (Ephesians 2:10).

According to Hebrews 10:39, what will those with true faith experience? *But we are not of those who shrink back to destruction, but of those who have faith to the preserving of the soul* (Hebrews 10:39).

G. TRUE SALVATION CREATES A LOVE THAT LABORS

Besides faith, what else does God take note of in the believer? *For God is not unjust so as to forget your work and the love which you have shown toward His name, in having ministered and in still ministering to the saints* (Hebrews 6:10).



Who is the source and how is He manifest in the life of a believer? *And hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out within our hearts through the Holy Spirit who was given to us* (Romans 5:5).

What is true of a person who is born of God? *Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. The one who does not love does not know God, for God is love* (1 John 4:7–8).

How does a true believer show love? *Little children, let us not love with word or with tongue, but in deed and truth. We will know by this that we are of the truth, and will assure our heart before Him* (1 John 3:18–19).

H. TRUE SALVATION CREATES A HOPE THAT ENDURES

Who does Jesus say will be saved? *“You will be hated by all because of My name, but it is the one who has endured to the end who will be saved”* (Matthew 10:22).

What gives us our motivation to endure? *For it is for this we labor and strive, because we have fixed our hope on the living God, who is the Savior of all men, especially of believers* (1 Timothy 4:10).

Describe the hope that a Christian has:

For we through the Spirit, by faith, are waiting for the hope of righteousness (Galatians 5:5).

But since we are of the day, let us be sober, having put on the breastplate of faith and love, and as a helmet, the hope of salvation (1 Thessalonians 5:8).

more that you love them than how much you know,” he says. “Truth is truth, whether it’s for a child in Sunday school or a senator.”

Through all the logistical challenges Jonathan remains grounded in the mission: to serve wherever God places him. “It’s an honor to serve the Lord here,” he says. “This is home. This is where God put us.”

Thanks to the support of Representative George Rauscher, who graciously hosts the meetings, Capitol Ministries Bible studies have found a consistent home in the state Capitol. “Without him, I’m not sure we’d be able to meet,” Jonathan shares, underscoring the powerful impact that spiritual and civic partnerships can have in opening doors for meaningful ministry.

Joseph Green

Helping believers understand what a Christian worldview is and why it's important for all who profess Christ to have one is a high priority for Dr. Joseph Green in his discipleship ministry to Pennsylvania legislators.

In teaching biblical foundations classes over the years, Dr. Green has discovered that many Christians do not fully understand the concepts of “apologetics” or a “Christian worldview.” What results is a disconnect between who they profess to be and how they behave. His mission is to help believers “connect the dots” by teaching them that Christian apologists “contend for the faith” and believers who hold a biblical worldview allow the faith they confess to shape how they perceive the world.

So that being justified by His grace we would be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life (Titus 3:7).

I. TRUE SALVATION CREATES THREE ATTRIBUTES THAT ABIDE

What three attributes did Paul notice about the Colossians? *Since we heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and the love which you have for all the saints; because of the hope laid up for you in heaven, of which you previously heard in the word of truth, the gospel (Colossians 1:4–5).*

III. APPLICATION

God is sovereign in salvation. The believer is not called to salvation because of his or her own worthiness but because of God’s purposes and grace.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ, just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we would be holy and blameless before Him. In love He predestined us to adoption as sons through Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the kind intention of His will, to the praise of the glory of His grace, which He freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace which He lavished on us. In all wisdom and insight He made known to us the mystery of His will, according to His kind intention which He purposed in Him with a view to an administration suitable to the fullness of the times, that is, the summing up of all things in Christ, things in the heavens and things on the earth. In Him also we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to His purpose who works all things after the counsel of His will, to the end that we who were the first to hope in Christ would be to the praise of His glory. In Him, you also, after listening to the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation—having also believed, you were sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit of promise, who is given as a pledge of our inheritance, with a view to the redemption of God’s own possession, to the praise of His glory (Ephesians 1:3–14).

Realizing that God has chosen you for salvation, how should you respond? *Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind,*



so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect (Romans 12:1–2).

What is the wrong response? *What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase? May it never be! How shall we who died to sin still live in it?* (Romans 6:1–2).

The true believer will be convicted of sin and turn from it. He will be willing to submit to God and follow Christ. A true believer will exhibit the following:

- A faith that works
- A love that labors
- A hope that endures

Those three qualities are present in every true believer and continually shape the direction of his or her life. Accordingly, Psalm 116:16–17 states:

*O LORD, surely I am Your servant,
I am Your servant, the son of Your handmaid,
You have loosed my bonds.
To You I shall offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving,
And call upon the name of the LORD.*

My desire is to give Christian legislators the opportunity to fulfill their God-given mandate as ministers of Christ.”
